EDUCATIONAL GOALS AND EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES

The teaching activity aims to promote the development of transversal skills in its participants, which represent a set of individual characteristics necessary for effective work performance. Being 'transversal', these skills can be activated in any professional position that requires them, and can be of a constructional, relational or cognitive nature, such as: result orientation, initiative, adaptability, empathy, leadership, conflict management, persuasion, group management, self-awareness, self-control, pattern recognition, systemic thinking, verbal communication, etc.

The course aims to accompany the participants in an exciting journey aimed at the deep understanding of their strengths and areas of improvement, the definition of their career goals and the identification of ways to achieve them, defining a development plan individual, useful for the preparation of their insertion in the labor market. The course constitutes a learning base that can be spent in different professional paths and target sectors.

More specifically, the activity aims to achieve these objectives:

- The definition of one's ideal working life
- Evaluation of one's own skills and learning style
- The interpretation of feedback on oneself: one's own strengths and weaknesses
- Propose elements of reflection that promote the ability to operate with awareness of their choice of training and work
- Encourage the possibility of realistically delineating one's professional goal, asking for a comparison with some data that allow a better understanding of one's own context
- Present opportunities and "tools" that can help in achieving their professional goal through active job search
- Present tools and techniques for active job search

PRE-REQUIREMENTS: For a profitable attendance to the course it is advisable to have carried out the curricular internship;

SYLLABUS: The course is divided in 5 teaching blocks.

TEACHING METHODS

The course includes 20 hours of lessons. In addition to lectures, students will be encouraged to participate and learn actively with exercises of various kinds. The problem solving and problem finding skills and communication skills will also be stimulated in the implementation of classroom exercises and simulations.

Simulations, role-playing games and case histories will also be held.

EVALUATION METHODS

For the students attending the course there will be an oral exam and a practical test consisting in a simulation of an active job search process.

TEXTBOOKS AND ON-LINE EDUCATIONAL MATERIAL

During the course will be distributed educational materials by the teacher (handouts, tests, videos). This material is sufficient for passing the exam tests only if coupled to the attendance at lectures and exercises.

INTERACTION WITH STUDENTS

The educational material (slides, exercises, educational material, video) will be provided to students who attend the course by sharing a folder on a cloud storage system or delivered on a USB pen.

Reception hours can be agreed with the teacher but, indicatively, will include at least one hour per week (Tuesday). The teacher is still available to students even outside reception hours by appointment by e-mail
